## ORCHIDACEAE

## Cypripedium elegans Rchb. f.

Distribution: INDIA: Uttarakhand (Garhwal, Kumaon), Sikkim; CHINA (NW Yunan); TIBET (SE Xizang); E. NEPAL and BHUTAN.

Habitat: At the edge of Abies forest and on steep slopes at edge of woodland, in clearings in bamboo and Abies forests, and under Juniperus bushes at 2800-4400 m.

Population status/Cause for RET: Rare. Destruction of habitat has led to the decline of this species.

Description: Terrestrial dwarf herbs, up to 30 cm tall. Leaves 3-4, alternate, 2.2-8 x 1.6-6.9 cm, broadly elliptic to oblong-lanceolate. Scape shorter than leaves. Flower solitary, ca 2.5 cm across, brownish with dark brown lines; dorsal sepal narrowly ovate; petals lanceolate, concave; lip shorter than sepals, depressed.
